

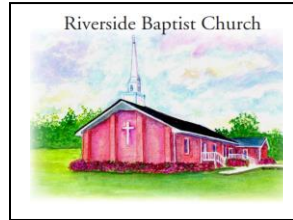

George and Betty Lewis were sent out of Greater Light Baptist Church and they were approved as Baptist Bible Fellowship missionaries to Brazil in May of 1967. In July of 1968, they arrived in the city of Recife where they served for 26 years. While they were there, they helped begin a Bible college which is still in operation today, under the direction of national pastors. The Lewis' also left behind 10 Baptist churches that are still flourishing. In February of 1993, the Lewis' heeded to God's call to the country of Romania. They served the Lord there for 10 years before God allowed them to return to Brazil. They arrived in Brazil for the second time in June of 2003 and during that time they worked in the southern part of the country with a young national pastor. They are presently serving the Lord in Sao Bernardo do Campo, where they have helped start three congregations and have helped begin another Bible college.
